Article 4: Why is the club expanding the board and not allowing members to directly elect the officers?	Expanding the Boardwith the club now approaching or at 1,100 members, there are more Events and Activities taking place, as well as the ongoing management of club operations. Adding two Directors will allow for the workload to spread across more people's schedules, and not cratering the current five Directors. Electing Directors rather than Officers: The process has been successfully used by other clubs; it's also the way a lot of businesses (and their Boards) operatethe Board decides who fills which role, not the shareholders. When a person puts their name forward for a position on the Board, the Nominating Committee or the Board will discuss with them what they "bring to the table", which role they would like to fill, and who is best qualified to fill each role. Someone who wants to be the club President could very likely be appointed to that position by the Board. If someone is elected to an Officer position, and is not well qualified for that position, there is currently no means for overturning a "less than optimal" placement. Also, currently, what means do club Members use to determine the qualifications of candidates? They likely rely solely on the bio information that is presented. On the other hand, an interview and discussions with the other Board members, who want to build a cohesive Executive Board, will result in people being placed in the best position to serve the club
Article 3, Section C: Why allow 12 guests per	membership. This change was to address a couple of situations:

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quarter per member?	 A Member who has a family visit and they want to play a couple of days during the visit. A Member who invites a local friend to play on a regular basis during a quarter. Further, Guests may only participate in a narrow range of opportunities (No Events like Rotations/Ladders - basically Open Play). AND only when the Member is present. Guests must sit out if Members are waiting.
